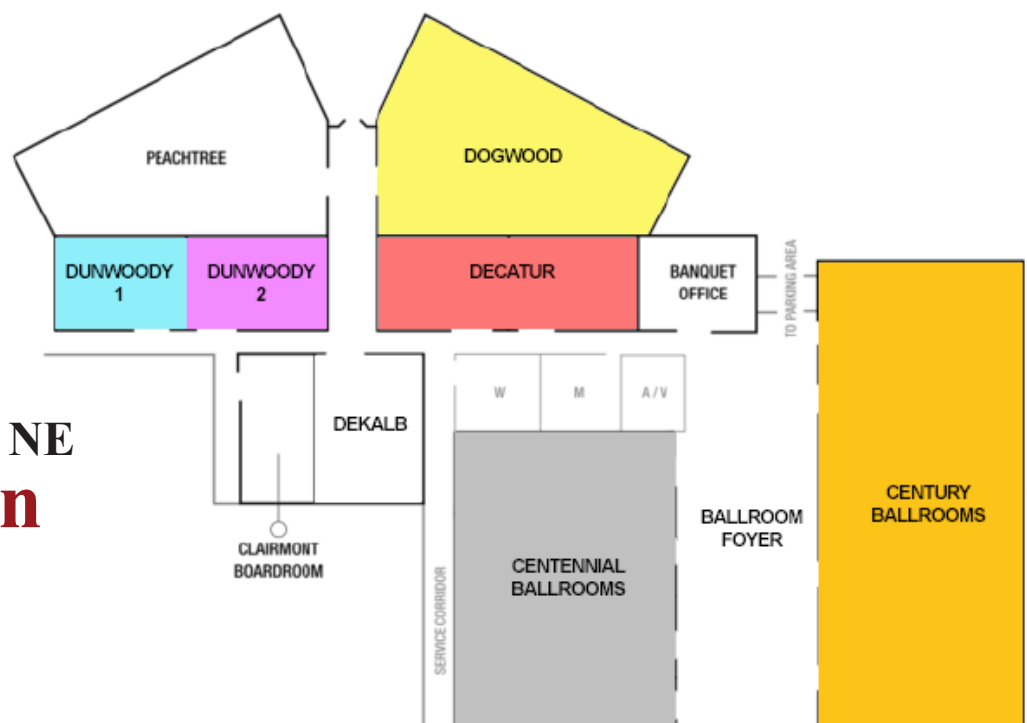

KEYNOTES

Driving Business Value and Maximizing Strategic Impact

Maria Scarangiella (Century Ballrooms)

As a talent professional, you can be a force multiplier to deliver critical business results. In this session, you will gain an understanding of how to measure your impact on improving performance, how to develop strong partnerships, and ways to communicate that resonate with your audience.

Six Types of Working Genius

Kevin Twomey (Century Ballrooms)

Everyone has natural, God-given talents when it comes to work. As it turns out, there are six different types of talents, or geniuses, and each of them is required for accomplishing any kind of endeavor. Each of us has two areas that are considered our true geniuses or gifts. These are the activities that give us joy, energy, and passion. We call these our areas of Working Genius. Two of the six types are what we call our Working Frustrations, activities that rob us of joy and energy. Most of us aren't very skilled in these areas. The final two are what we refer to as Working Competencies, activities that neither feed nor drain us and which we can do fairly well for a limited period of time. The Six Types of Working Genius form an interdependent model, a comprehensive process for accomplishing any type of work. Each type of genius receives and/or gives something to adjacent types, creating a natural workflow starting with Wonder and culminating in Tenacity.

CONCURRENT SESSIONS 1

Shift Happens: Embracing Change Management in Learning and Development for Organizational Success!

Change is inevitable in organizations, and the learning and development function is crucial in supporting successful change initiatives. This presentation explores the change management principles and how they can be explicitly applied to L&D programs. Artificial Intelligence: Preparing People for the Human Machine Partnerships of the Future

Researchers predict that by 2030, 70% of all companies will have deployed AI and it could impact as many as 60% of all jobs. Leaders who hope to benefit from AI's full potential, including those responsible for developing human capital, have a lot to think about. We'll review key research from outside experts about the impact AI is expected to have on the workplace as well as new findings from Dale Carnegie & Associates on employees' attitudes toward AI and its use in specific applications. We'll also share the skills needed for people to work most effectively alongside AI and three imperatives that should be part of plans to prepare people when undergoing digital transformation of any kind.

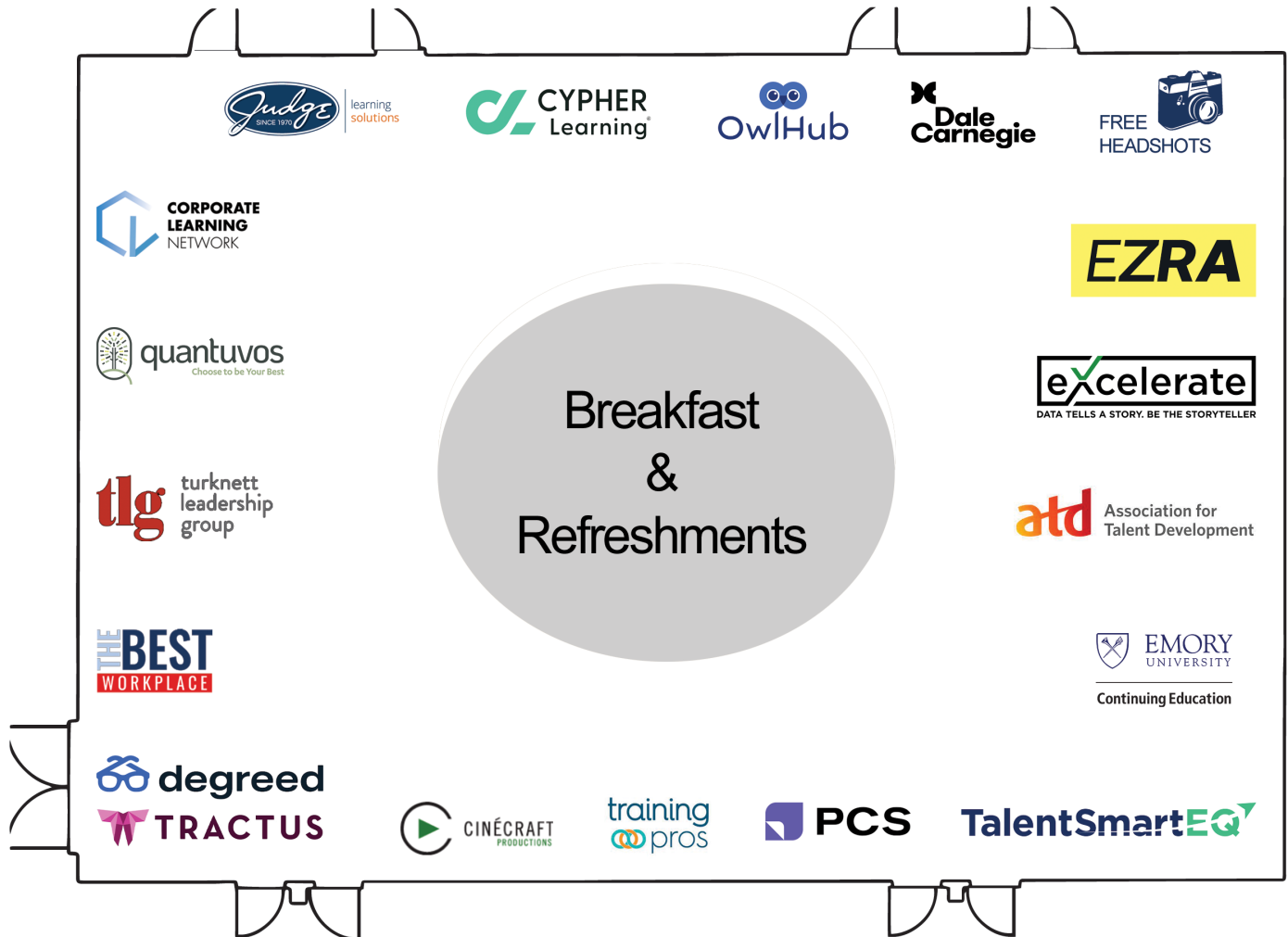
Coaching Styles Will Shape the Future of Leadership Development: New Research to Transform How We Coach and Train Leaders.
